Course Objectives

- Describe the impact of pediatric trauma for children, families and health care systems as it pertains to quality of life, long-term productivity, and financial and health care resource utilization.
- Identify the impact of effective trauma systems on improved outcomes.
- Discuss the rationale for obtaining early chest radiograph in the trauma bay for children requiring airway management.
- Explain the current level of interpersonal violence in teens and children in the U.S. compared to other countries, and compared to earlier periods in the U.S.
- Cite the epidemiology and public health approach to understanding youth violence—that it is a disease with causes, treatments and prevention strategies, and recognize several evidence-based prevention strategies for youth violence.
- Discuss the epidemiology of child maltreatment with a focus on abusive head trauma.
- Discuss current management of pediatric blunt abdominal trauma and proposed changes in management guidelines.
- Discuss care of the injured child in the pediatric intensive care unit.
- Discuss current evidence-based management guidelines for children with severe traumatic brain injury and understand research that may affect management.
- Discuss rehabilitation of the injured child.
